Why a Mission Statement?

- Transform the dreams of your vision into more specific terms
- Explain your goals and purpose to others
- Increase the chances that potential members will be attracted
- Reassure funding sources that your initiative is a good investment



Mission vs Vision

HOW A VISION STATEMENT DIFFERS FROM A MISSION STATEMENT

MISSION

- Present tense
- Describes what you do & who/what benefits from this work

VISION

- Future Objective
- Description of a future you are ultimately working towards

Mission vs Vision cont.

Mission statements and vision statements are complementary but unique.

- MISSION: To create lasting solutions to poverty, hunger, and social injustice.
- VISION: A just world without poverty.



Establishing a Mission

Mission Statement—the essential:

- What the group does—core functions and activities
- Why it exists—review the vision





An Example Mission Statement

WHY: "Creating healthy communities for children through prevention, early

WHAT: intervention, and family support

"Creating healthy communities for children through prevention, early intervention, and family support"



An Example Mission Statement

WHY: "To develop a safe and healthy neighborhood

WHAT: through collaborative planning, community action, and policy advocacy"

"To develop a safe and healthy neighborhood through collaborative planning, community action, and policy advocacy"

Attributes of a Good Mission Statement

Guidelines for selecting and completing your Mission

- 5-14 words total. 20 max.
- 8th grade reading level. 10th grade max.
- Target < 20 syllables total. 30 max.
- Avoid long or complicated words

- Clear
- Concise
- Outcome oriented
- Robust
- Inclusive



Example Mission Statements

- The Humane Society: Celebrating Animals, Confronting Cruelty. (4 words)
- Monterey Bay Aquarium: To inspire conservation of the oceans. (6)
- Wounded Warrior Project: To honor and empower wounded warriors. (6)
- Kiva: To connect people through lending to alleviate poverty. (8)
- **Livestrong:** To inspire and empower people affected by cancer. (8)
